




up with the trends in fashion, hairstyles
and make-up.

Look at her fashionable hairstyle. Isn't it lovely? It's based on the traditional chignon, where the long hair is tied up in a roll or knot at the back of the head. Can you match the names with the right Tang chignon styles?

### Duomaji Fanwanji

Known as "falling off a horse", this offcentre and drooping chignon was favoured by middle-aged women.



### Pa

The double back knotted chignon was formed by tying up the hair at the back, then holding it up and securing it on top of the head.



#### Paojiaji

The hair of this style went around the temples to form a chignon like a pyramid on top of the head.



#### Gaoii

This high chignon piled up the hair upright on top of the head.



### Wadua

Another off-centre and drooping chignon, this was based on the duomaji style.


